



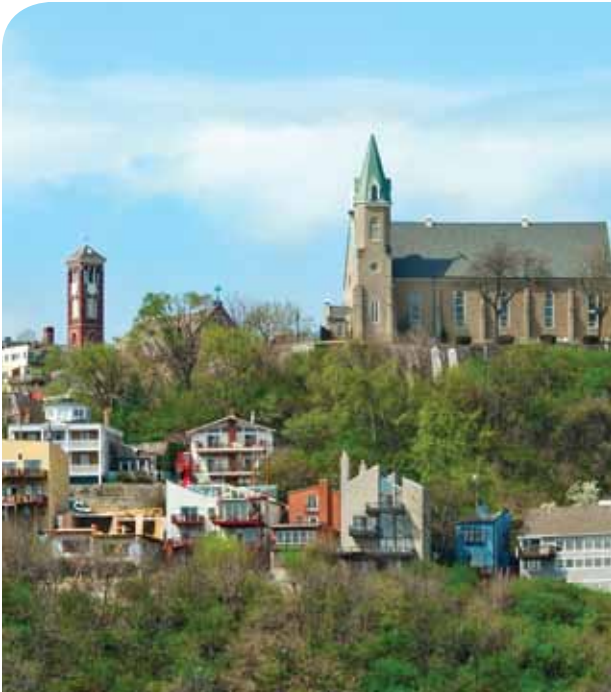

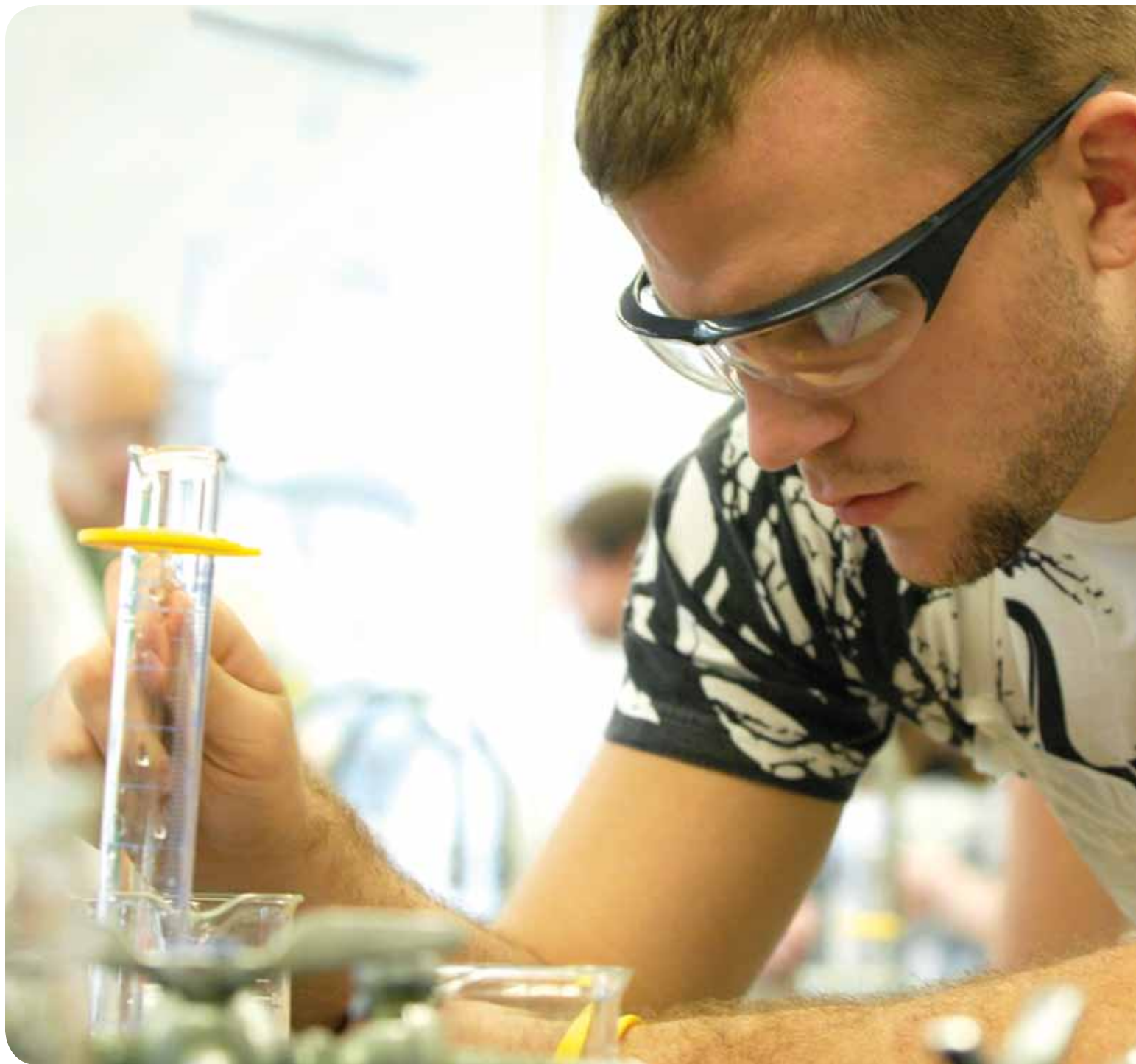

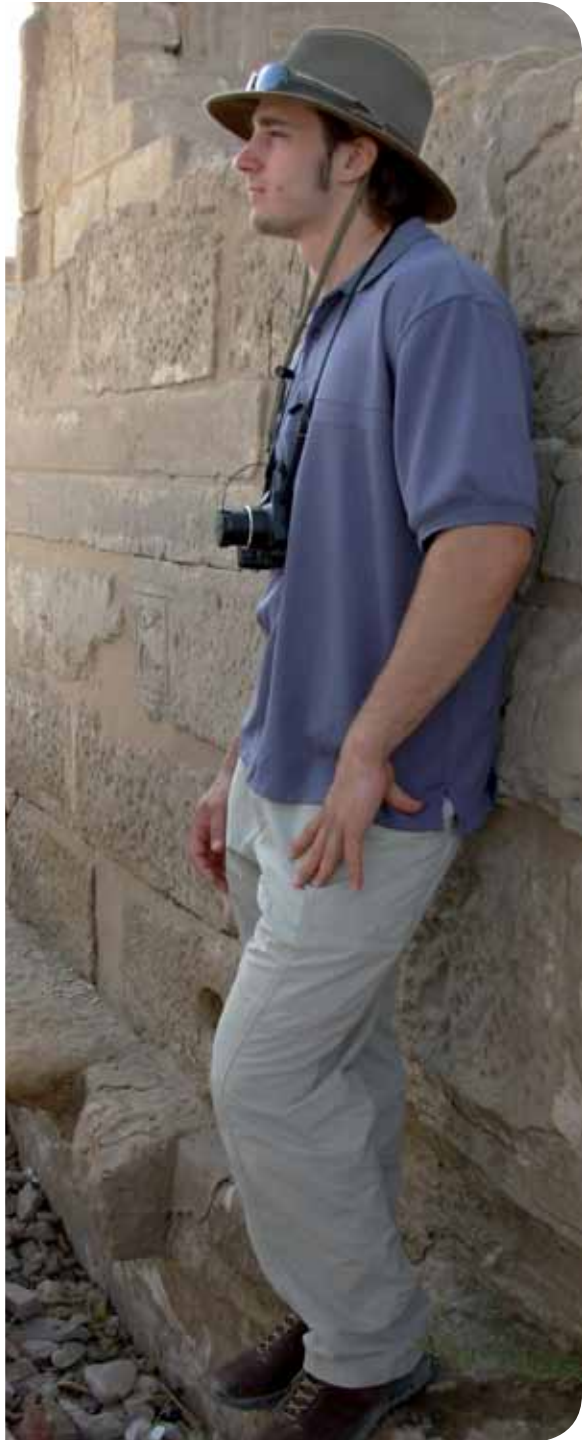

At the Mount, you will learn through action – paid co-op positions, serving others, graduate-level research, and leadership development. And, a 10:1 student-to-faculty ratio means that learning occurs through dialogue and experiences, not just lectures and exams. From orientation to graduation, you'll work side-by-side award-winning professors, experienced advisors, fellow learners, and more.



Academics A variety of more than 35 majors plus more than 25 minors gives you endless options as you plan your future. Combine a natural science major with a minor in forensic science to prepare for a medical degree. Or, become an art therapist with a double major in art and psychology.

Mission in Action Put your Catholic education into action through the Cultural Immersion and Service Learning programs. Live with Lakota Sioux Plains Indians of Pine Ridge, South Dakota. Explore Greece and its history. Experience the culture of Appalachia.

Support and Assistance The Learning Center is here to assist your individual needs through academic adjustments and auxiliary aids, which include peer tutors, study groups, and the Math and Writing centers. Guidance and Advice As a Mount student you have the benefit of experienced advisors and support programs. The Academic Exploration Program guides undecided students in finding a major. Your personal academic advisor will help you plan and achieve your goals.

More than 86 percent of recent graduates responding to a survey are either employed full time or pursuing additional studies. After incorporating your classroom lessons into professional situations you will leave the Mount a leader prepared for the real-world.



Cooperative Education In 2008 Mount co-ops earned an average of \$10.52 per hour, and more than \$1 million in combined wages. More than 25 percent of co-op graduates accept full-time jobs with their co-op employers after graduation. This is an excellent way to gain professional work experience in your field of study. **Earn and Learn** The Mount is dedicated to finding every available scholarship, loan and grant for its students. In addition to your financial aid package, working can help cover your college expenses. You'll gain necessary skills for the real world while refining your work ethic. In many cases, working will validate your choice of major, further preparing you to enter life one step ahead. **Work Study** Every little bit helps. The Work Study program places students in part-time jobs on campus as another source of income during college. **Career Center** Students and alumni take advantage of the Career & Experiential Education Center for guidance and networking. You can also find part-time work through the Career Center or participate in job search, resume development and interviewing workshops.
